This is an email I sent out to some friends earlier. Thought I'd pass it along in case you're interested. It's a little drier than some stuff, but thought-provoking nonetheless (the other person's writing, not my own). The *[italicized]* stuff is the interesting stuff to me. The rest is for context.

So I'm reading a book called "The Mature Mind," by Harry Overstreet. It's fascinating on many levels. I'm sharing it with you now, because we've had so many discussions about the frustrations of evangelicalism, the sort of nationalism promoted (demanded) by the likes of Bush and Palin and other such topics. This is a broader discussion on (you may have guessed by the title) what it takes to have a mature mind--and a mature society.

Here's an excerpt from a section called "Forces that shape us":

**Editor's Note:** I shortened the excerpt for brevity.

*Three major strains in our cultural philosophy compete for dominance. In certain times and places, they engage in open warfare. In others, they exist side by side in a state of uneasy truce. In yet others, they engage in a hearty and*

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*superficial pretense that, in spite of minor differences, they all belong to one big happy family. Their warfare, their uneasy truces, and their sophistic agreements are reflected, in some measure, in the practices of our every institution--social, political, economic, educational, religious--and in the behaviors of every member of our culture.*

*The first strain is that of authoritarianism, both religious and political. Strict orthodoxy--whether Catholic, Protestant or of some other sort--encourages a certain type of character structure. The "believer" is rated as sincere and wholehearted to the extent that he takes things on faith and exempts certain areas of experience from critical examination. To the extent that he is thus "sound," he leaves to some vested authority--priest, minister, or other--the major responsibility of defining his spiritual responsibility. Thus, in a double sense, he is invited to remain immature: mentally, in that he foregoes his human right to ask, as an individual, certain questions that have tantalized the mind of man ever since he became man; and emotionally, in that he accepts a basic spiritual dependence as his lifelong estate. The rewards offered him for being thus a "believer" also tend to perpetuate his psychological childhood: on the one hand, he is permitted, during his term on earth, to feel himself a member of the "elect," different from the unregenerate crowd of people variously lost in error; and on the other hand, he is permitted to anticipate a sort of cosmic accolade that will be his private own through a perpetual and unsharing bliss...*

*...Patriotism has, for the most part, taken forms that have encouraged uncritical adherence to the policies of one's own nation--"my country right or wrong"--and a blunting of the imagination as to the needs, rights, and attitudes of the people of other nations. The effect of the nationalistic patriotisms has been to discourage linkages of understanding, sympathy, and co-operation with other nations--and with the people of those nations--and to encourage the kind of exclusiveness that fosters suspicion and hostility...*

*...Thus the strain of authoritarianism in our culture--whether religious or political or both--has been powerful to hold the average individual in a condition of immature dependence. In the chief matters of his concern he has had to learn how to forego independence of judgment and creative initiative and be willing to accept life as fashioned for him by powers that claim his grateful adherence but deny him the right to think freely for himself. [End Excerpt]*

The main reason I find this discussion fascinating is the Mr. Overstreet wrote it in 1949.

Yet it remains relevant and a perfect description for so much we see today--religious zealotry, an almost fascist-style demand for nationalism. We accuse people who disagree with the (their) government of being unpatriotic simply for disagreeing with something the government has done. And we see a blending of religion and politics that demands, as the last sentence says, that we do not think for ourselves.

I suppose it was only inevitable that religion and politics would mix on this front. People who seek the luxury of feeling they are members of the elite must give over their right to think for themselves. Both religion and politics offer fertile ground on this front (in fundamentalist extremes).

It's never been the religion or the political party that was the problem. It's always the extremism that occurs when we let the religion or party become more important than the free thinking that began them--the free thinking that was necessary to arrive at the ideas the religion or party was first founded upon.

Well, that's my diatribe for the day. I just thought I'd share it with a few of you. I suppose I might post it on my blog as well, but I'm not so good at keeping up with that. :)
